- e. Local Holiday Helping Hands Initiatives: Update Lisa Last
 - i. The Lighthouse, Clay County Law Enforcement/First Responders & Clay Center Elks hosted "Shop with a Cop" on Saturday for 50 USD 379 kids. Each child had \$100 to spend at Gibsons. As always, it was an awesome event!

- i. We just received \$125,000 continuation grant to continue Drug Free Communities
- ii. We just received \$105,000 continuation grant to continue Drug Endangered Children
 - 1. Much of this is being sent on community education projects

- Unite Kansas is a coordinated care network consisting of healthcare, government, nonprofit, and other organizations. These network partners use Unite Us software to securely identify, deliver, and pay for services that address the needs of individuals within their communities.
