I. What I Can Learn Time

Pawnee Mental Health School Based Mental Health Services in USD #379: Colleen O'Connell

- Currently partnered with 8 different school districts, including 379
 - Currently serving about 7-8 students (only a year into the program)
 Only at Clay Center, but looking to expand to Wakefield next year
- School Based Services program delivers crucial mental health support directly with the school environment
- Can include face-to-face (school provides the space for this)
- Community Psychiatric Support and Treatment (CPST), Psychosocial Rehabilitation-Individual (PRI), Attendant Care (AC), Targeted Case Management (TCM)
- There are also parent/peer support options available
- If they already have services outside of Pawnee, referrals can still be made
- Lisa Last (<u>lisalast@usd379.org</u>) can help you get set up with these services
 - There is a criteria that must be met before they qualify
 - Insurance is required at this time, but they are looking for grants that can bypass this
